Program Planning

Six Steps to Achieving Your Ideal Year of Scouting:

- Plan
- Fund
- Grow
- Train
- Recharter
- Assess





Step 1: Plan

- Gather key dates from school, charter partner, Council calendar
- Review last year's program
- Brainstorm new opportunites
- Prioritize
- Publish written plan and calendar
- Buy in from Scouts, adult leaders and parents



Step 2: Fund



Use Budget tools to develop a realistic unit budget

- Plan for anticipated and unanticipated expenses
- Encourage Scouts to set goals
- Do the work needed to raise the funds

Step 3: Grow



Fall roundup preparations underway. Check with District Executives regarding materials, trainings, and dates.

Include onboarding new adult leaders and training in your plans for growth.



Step 4: Train



- Position-specific training required for all adult leader positions in Scouting [except Unit Scouter Reserve (Position Code 91U) only requires Youth Protection Training]
- Training available at my.scouting.org or find courses on the Council website/training calendar
- Existing leaders check your training record and required training on the my.scouting.org website
- Every Scout deserves trained leadership





Step 5: New Membership Process

- Beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who joined Scouting were enrolled in a 12-month membership cycle and BSA ceased prorating fees
- Both youth and adults pay the full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on the anniversary date of joining Scouting
- Each registered member of the BSA will receive an e-mail notice with a registration renewal link beginning 60 days before the anniversary of having joined Scouting
- Unit leaders will receive a copy of the e-mail and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering





Step 5: New Membership Process (continued)

- As of March 2024, the anniversary date for existing youth and adult members will be their unit recharter month (usually January)
- Existing youth and adult members moving forward will use the same process as new members
- Again, unit leaders will receive a copy of the e-mail and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process for existing members
- Unit leaders still responsible for verifying leadership roster, confirming necessary positions filled, and paying \$100 recharter fee on unit's anniversary date





Step 6: Assess

- At the end of the program year, review and assess your unit's program
- Involve Scouts in the process
- Keep records so you will be ready when it is time to start planning again
- Utilize Journey to Excellence program to plan, monitor and evaluate performance and ability to serve youth

Youth Protection Reminder

All registered adults must keep Youth Protection Certification current (required every two years).

BSA National sends e-mail approximately 90 days before expiration (must keep my.scouting.org e-mail current).

Council "Zero Tolerance" Policy: Adult leaders will be removed from Council roster if not current and will need to re-apply (including payment of registration fees).

All units should show "It Happened to Me" or "A Time to Tell" as part of a unit meeting each year.

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be registered as an adult volunteer or an adult program participant (except for Cub Scout parents or legal guardians).
